ORDER AUTHORIZING THE RELEASE OF PRESENTENCE INVESTIGATIONS TO OTHER STATES GOVERNED BY INTERSTATE COMPACT RULES


Whereas Nebraska Revised State 29-2261 (6) states, "Any presentence report or psychiatric examination shall be privileged and shall not be disclosed directly or indirectly to anyone other than a judge, probation officers to whom an offender's file is duly transferred, the probation administrator or his or her designee, or others entitled by law to receive such information, including personnel and mental health professionals for the Nebraska State Patrol specifically assigned to sex offender registration and community notification for the sole purpose of using such report or examination for assessing risk and for community notification of registered sex offenders. For purposes of this subsection, mental health professional means (a) a practicing physician licensed to practice medicine in this state under the Medicine and Surgery Practice act, (b) a practicing psychologist licensed to engage in the practice of psychology in this state as provided in section 38-311, or (c) a practicing mental health professional licensed or certified in this state as provided in the Mental Health Practice Act. The court may permit inspection of the report or examination of parts thereof by the offender or his or her attorney, or other person having a proper interest therein, whenever the court finds it is in the best interest of the particular offender. The court may allow fair opportunity for an offender to provide additional information for the court's consideration".






This is a blanket authorization for purposes of transferring offenders to other states through the Interstate Compact Offender Tracking System (ICOTS).

Be it understood that information found in presentence investigation reports may include drug and/or alcohol abuse information which is protected under the Federal Confidentiality regulations (42 CFR, Part 2). Any further disclosure of information other than for purposes of probation supervision is prohibited without specific written consent, or as otherwise prohibited by such regulations.



STANDING ORDER OF THE HALL COUNTY DISTRICT COURT
CONCERNING CHILD SUPPORT REFEREE EXCEPTION TRANSCRIPTS

The undersigned, as Presiding Judge in the Hall County District Court, being fully advised in the premises, hereby FINDS AND ORDERS as follows:

1. The District Courts hear and will continue to hear Exceptions to the Reports and Recommendations of the Child Support Referee. These Exceptions involve the preparation of transcripts of the proceedings had by the Referee.
2. That in the interest of judicial economy and to promote prompt resolution of Child Support Referee Exceptions, this STANDING ORDER is hereby entered in Hall County District Court child support referee cases:
 - A. A party filing an exception shall deposit the sum of \$100.00 with the Clerk of the District Court for the preparation of a transcript. This deposit shall be made at the time of filing the exception. Any amounts remaining after the preparation of the transcript shall be refunded to the depositing party.
 - B. Indigent persons who request and are granted *In Forma Pauperis* status shall not be required to pay a deposit for the preparation of the transcript.
 - C. A transcript of the proceedings shall be prepared and filed with the Clerk of the District Court within forty-five (45) days of the deposit being paid. The court reporter preparing the transcript shall also submit an invoice for the cost of preparation to be paid from the deposit made by the litigant.
 - D. The Clerk of the District Court shall provide notice to the District Court that the transcript is prepared and the matter ready to proceed to hearing upon the filing of the transcript.
