

Hall County Poll Worker Application

The Hall County Election Office recruits and trains more than 100 poll workers for each state and federal election held in May and November in even-numbered years. Poll workers set up and take down polling sites, check in voters, issue ballots and are integral to the democratic process. The hours are 7 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Election Day. Pay rates vary, starting at minimum wage. Poll workers must be a registered voter in the county, must be able to read and write English, must attend a two-hour training session, and must not be a candidate on the ballot or directly related to a candidate.
